The consultant was visiting the Burraton Cross junction and vicinity on the 27th July 2016. A "wash-up session" for the Steering Group was being organised.

Discussions on a "Humber Bridge style" connection between the waterfront and Fore Street was being explored.

Theme Team B – Making Community. (Cllr. D Yates)

SB-F advised that important proposals relating to the Waterfront and Railway Station might require Environmental Impact and Sustainability Assessments.

Theme Team C – Housing (formerly Live, Play and Grow.)

The updated Policy Grid had been circulated prior to the meeting.

Work on affordable housing and the views of local estate agents and developers were being obtained and the consequences of the Inspector's latest statements on the Cornwall Local Plan needed to be examined.

RT advised that Persimmon Homes wished to make a presentation to the Steering Group on their Latchbrook planning proposals and site delivery statement. DY referred to the Developer Protocol previously prepared by the Steering Group and indicated that he and BA would need to discuss the protocol with the new Mayor and Town Clerk and agree on how to proceed. WH was asked to circulate the protocol to DY, BA and RT.

Theme Team D – Invest, Work and Learn. (Cllr. D Yates)

Consideration needed to be made of the area of Saltash (principally the Salt Mill Estate) defined as by the Index of Multiple Deprivation as being in the top 30% of deprived areas in the UK. The Community Led Cornwall Group was examining how long term economic growth could be achieved in such areas.

Policy Integrity Tests.

It was agreed that as part of the policy forming process that four Policy Integrity Tests be conducted to challenge the alignment, robustness and integrity of proposed policies embodied within the Saltash Neighbourhood Plan before going public. The Tests would be:-

Test 1 : Do policies align with the Cornwall Local Plan and Saltash DPD/Framework?

Do SNP policies enable the delivery of Local Plan requirements? Do they adhere to Local Plan policies?

Test 2: Do policies align with Resident and Business Sector Questionnaire results

Do SNP policies express the wishes of the community?

Test 3: Have Policies been derived in accordance with the Constitution of the Steering Group?

Have they been formulated in accordance with the Code of Conduct? Has representation been sufficiently broad, balanced and proportionate?

Test 4. Will policies deliver the Vision and Objectives?
