**CONSULTATION ON PROPOSALS TO CAP PARISH AND TOWN COUNCILS**

The Cornwall Association of Local Councils (CALC) recently notified all parish and town councils in Cornwall of a consultation by the Department of Communities and Local Government on 'Local Referendums to Veto Excessive Council Tax Increases'. CALC has requested now for all Parish/Town councils to provide them with a response as soon as possible. The CALC Executive Committee will be meeting shortly to put together a county response to this consultation which they will then circulate to all members. The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) will also be collating each county association response in order to put in a national response too. Although the Government's deadline is Sept 10<sup>th</sup> 2010, NALC has asked for all county associations input to be received by them by 27<sup>th</sup> August.

Members heard that this proposal would give a way to cap the level of precept applied for each year by parish and town councils – the precept being fundamental to pay for what this level of local government provides in the community. Members discussed at length the full implication of such local referendum being introduced.

Cllr A Killeya thought that the cost to the community associated with holding local referendums may end up being more expensive to each resident than any actual precept increase. He added that the budgets for Town and Parish councils, being smaller, are more likely to vary in percentage terms due to one or two additional items.

Cllr Clements said that Parish/Town councils are expected in the future to take on more services and so having to spend more but yet there is a possibility of capping the necessary funds to pay for it all.

Cllr Riches said he was opposed to this proposal as he felt that the Government are not in a position to understand exactly what local needs are whereas Parish/Town councils do. It would clamp down any future development of communities in villages and towns as it would prevent any local schemes from going ahead i.e. if there was a need to raise funds via the precept for an essential community project, such as the cemetery extension, projects would be blighted.

Cllr M Killeya expressed her opposition to this proposal and agreed with Cllr Riches. She added that the Government on one hand is dictating localism but inhibiting it at the same time with a scheme such as this.

Cllr Holley also expressed that he is very opposed to this. He felt that the actual precept sum raised via council tax from each resident is quite small and that this proposal is actually a political move to obtain good publicity.

Cllr A Killeya added that any increase in precept, in real terms, would actually only be a matter of pence for each resident.

It was unanimously **RESOLVED** that the Town Council send a letter to CALC with a copy to be sent to Sheryl Murray MP.

Members were asked to submit their comments to the Clerk by e-mail within the next week.
