Saltash's new Mayor for the next year has been confirmed at the recent Mayor Choosing Ceremony as Councillor Bill Phillips, with his wife Mrs Jean Phillips becoming the Mayoress. Councillor Hilary Frank is the new Deputy Mayor and her Consort is Mr Shojiro Frank.



The ceremony opened on 12 May at the Guildhall with a welcome speech from the outgoing Mayor, Cllr Jean Dent, who then proposed the election of Cllr Bill Phillips to the position of Mayor of the Town, Cllr Derek Holley spoke about Bill's suitability for this key civic role and his longstanding involvement in Saltash activities

and organisations. After declaring his Acceptance of Office, Bill placed the Mayoress chain on his wife Mrs Jean Phillips. The tradition of tossing hot



pennies and fruit to children waiting in the street below the Chamber was carried out with much enthusiasm by the new Mayor and Mayoress!

The election of Cllr Hilary Frank to the Deputy Mayor position was proposed by Cllr Bob Austin, who summarised her career and community achievements before Cllr Joe Ellison seconded the proposal and spoke of Hilary's energy and enthusiasm for the wide-ranging

public work she undertakes.

Reverend Michelle Parkman has been chosen by the Mayor as his Chaplain for the coming year, and the Mayor's Cadet position has been taken up by Corporal Yazmin Leverton.


easy access to such an impressive range of everyday goods, treats, services and food outlets right on our

to Saltash Town Council in 2010, and to Cornwall Council in 2013. Born and raised in Cornwall, Hilary is Vice Chair of the Governors of Bishop Cornish Church of England Primary School. which both her daughters attend. As part of a career

specialising in Japanese, Hilary has helped deliver an Olympic Games, a FIFA World Cup and a Longmans dictionary. She is currently working with the 2019 Rugby World Cup committee.

Interesting facts you may not know about Hilary are that she was the first non-Japanese person to be asked by the Imperial Household Agency to act as interpreter for the Emperor of Japan, she met her Japanese husband Shojiro at a sumo wrestling match, and they got married in a bright red Shinto shrine in the middle of Tokvo!
