



Consultation on how the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) money should be allocated and spent

Dear partners and stakeholders,

Hopefully you are aware that we will begin to charge a Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) on new developments, given planning permission, from January 2019.

You can read more about the Community Infrastructure Levy on the Council's website www.cornwall.gov.uk/cil

15% of any Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) will be given to Town and Parish Councils to use in the area where the levy was paid. An additional 10% of the levy raised will be given to local councils that have a Neighbourhood Development Plan.

As well as previous public consultations we have attended Town and Parish Council conferences to discuss the Community Infrastructure Levy and will be attending the Planning Partnership during August.

Cornwall Council has to decide how the remainder of the Community Infrastructure Levy is spent, by whom and on what. We would now like to hear your further views to inform the Council's broad approach to the allocation and spend of the Community Infrastructure Levy.

Importantly, the allocation of the remaining 70% - 80% 'strategic share' is at the discretion of Cornwall Council, which is the focus of the current survey. We are seeking views on how the 'strategic share' should be allocated and the type of infrastructure it should be spent on.

The public consultation runs until 23 September, however we appreciate local councils may not meet before then, and to give local councils the opportunity to give their feedback, we will accept completed surveys after the closing date.

If you are unable to submit a formal response before 23 September, please provide an informal response with a 'holding position' initially which you can confirm with a formal response later. Please send your informal response, with the title 'CIL consultation' by email to: cil@cornwall.gov.uk

The results of the survey will be reported to Cornwall Council committees this autumn and the Council's Cabinet in December 2018.
