Save the date: Localism Summit on 6 November

Town and Parish Councillors and Clerks are invited to attend the annual Localism Summit on Wednesday 6 November in the Pavilion Centre at the Royal Cornwall Showground.

The Summit will focus on what the future holds for localism in Cornwall and how Cornwall Council and Town and Parish Councils can support our communities. Key note speaker Tony Armstrong, the CEO of LOCALITY and Chair of the Communities Partnership Board, will speak about the influence Cornwall is having at national level and how communities, with the right support can unlock the power they have to improve local services and deal with the issues that matter most to them.

Morning registration will start at 9.30am and the first session will begin at 10am. The Summit will end at 3.30pm. **Please let your community link officer know how many**

Community Governance Review update

Cornwall Council is undertaking a Community Governance Review for the whole of Cornwall to ensure community governance arrangements reflect the identity and interest of your local communities and work as conveniently and effectively as possible.

We have published all <u>submissions for change or no change</u> made during Stage 1 of the review. We are now in Stage 2 of the review, which involves the Council agreeing a set of draft recommendations for public consultation. This stage is currently envisaged to conclude in December 2019. The Draft Recommendations will be the subject of a full public consultation, which will take place in the first three months of 2020.

A series of <u>public engagement meetings</u> is currently underway to hear views about submissions that involve significant boundary changes and/or the creation of new councils. The meetings are attracting considerable public interest and are generating useful feedback that will help the Electoral Review Panel to make its draft recommendations.

Parish Councils are reminded they have until 4 October to comment in writing on submissions received from third parties affecting their parish.

Share your views in the waste customer satisfaction survey

Every year Biffa Environmental Municipal Services Ltd, our waste, recycling, street and beach cleansing services contractor, gives residents the opportunity to say what they think about these services via a customer satisfaction survey. **This year's survey will**

go live on 1 October and will close on 31 October 2019.

The survey will take about 10 minutes to complete. All responses will be anonymous and will be used to address any local issues and to help manage the contract as efficiently as possible.

Get online at home

If you know someone in Cornwall who is looking for an affordable way to get online, the Get Online @ Home scheme could be the answer.

Get Online @ Home provides low cost, internet ready, refurbished PCs, laptops and tablets to help home users, community groups and charities get online. The scheme is Microsoft's Digital Inclusion initiative, and people in Cornwall have access to it through Cornwall Council's strategic partnership with Microsoft.

Prices start from £99 for a Windows 10 refurbished PC, including a 19 inch flat screen monitor, keyboard and mouse. Tablets start from £139 and laptops start from £169. All packages for home users, community groups and charities include Windows 10 Professional, Microsoft Office 2010 (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and Outlook) and Windows Defender Antivirus. Six month warranties and delivery are also included in the price, and there's no minimum or maximum order size.

There's also a 5% discount if people enter the code '**corn19**' online or quote it over the phone.

Three ways with garden waste

Households in Cornwall are being encouraged to dispose of their garden waste properly by home composting, subscribing to the Council's garden waste collection service or driving their garden waste to their nearest Household Waste Recycling Centre.

There's a buy one, get one half price offer on home compost bins which can be used to recycle most kitchen and garden waste into a free supply of compost.

For those who aren't into composting, subscribing to the garden waste collection service means we'll come and collect grass cuttings, hedge trimmings and weeds every two weeks, year round. Plus there's a discount for those who subscribe online. All the garden waste we collect is composted at sites in Hayle, Roche and St Tudy and used on local farmland.

The aim is to encourage more people to take up a career in the care sector with a predicted 7,000 more carers needed by 2035 to cope with rising demand. Buy with Confidence is a national scheme that enables business to show their commitment to operating in a legal, honest and fair way by being vetted by Trading Standards.
