

### If someone should enter your premises in distress please:


- Contact their parent/carer/support worker. They may be carrying a card with the appropriate telephone number, or check if they have a mobile.
- Call the **Police** on their behalf if they are in immediate danger or a crime has been committed.
- If you are concerned about the person, but they are not in immediate danger, call Cornwall Council on 0300 1234 131 or email adultsafeguardingconcerns@cornwall.gov.uk (If you are not from a government agency emails need to be encrypted.)

Some people who need your help may be scared or have problems telling you what is wrong.

Showing them these photos may help them to tell you what the problem is.

# Ideas for information required when reporting incidents/crimes

- Name of person completing this form and premises
- Name of reporting person
- Address
- Contact phone number
- Name of supporting person (if required)
- Address
- Contact phone number
- Time & date of incident
- Location of incident
- If known names of those involved
- Not known description of those involved
- Describe incident free text
- Suspect vehicle details





#### **Reporting to the Police**

#### If Urgent ring '999' or If Non-Urgent ring '101'

Here is some general advice on making a phone call to the Police. Once a phone call is made an Incident Log Report will be created and a unique reference will be passed to you.

Remain calm and keep the person concerned feeling safe and reassured. If needed, wait for the police to turn up.

If you can, please make some notes around the incident - incident location, time, offender(s), witnesses etc., before the police arrive. The first police unit on the scene will take down these details.

#### Devon and Cornwall Police + Truevision 3rd party reporting.

If You or the Person concerned and/or their carer wish they can make a report to police on a computer via the third party reporting website <a href="www.report-it.org.uk">www.report-it.org.uk</a> or via the Devon and Cornwall Police website. The report can be anonymous, but this will form a part of an investigation or an intelligence picture. Known details will aid the investigation of any hate incident / crime.
