# What are the main activities of your organization?

We provide practical and emotional support, particularly for older people living with long-term sight loss or those recently diagnosed. We know from experience that losing your sight is traumatic. For most people it is devastating news, emotionally distressing and takes time to adapt, initially they're consumed by the belief that they have no hope of leading an active, independent life ever again. The emotional reaction resembles that of grieving and can lead to feelings of isolation and depression.

We are there every step of the way; it can take a few months or even a few years.

We are the only dedicated and free resource centre for anyone affected by a visual impairment, whatever their age, circumstance or condition. Our 220 active volunteers, without whom we could not run our services, support our small staff team. We rely totally on the generosity of donations. Last year, we supported more than 4,000 local people in their homes and in the community with:

- Low vision assessments and provision of free magnifying aids,
   lighting and daily living equipment
- Assistive technology assessments and provision of audio and magnification equipment including tablets, computers, phones
- Community visits at home
- Social clubs & activities e.g. rifle shooting, bowling, dancing and social clubs
- Advice and support with benefit and welfare claims, Warm Home Discounts, Blue Badge applications, Blind People's Tax Allowance
- Specialist support for eye clinic appointments and information about eye conditions and eye health
- Practical and emotional support e.g. befriending

Project title:	'By Your Side' – Community Outreach

Description of project (please continue on a separate sheet if necessary):	To extend our Community Outreach service in Saltash to support more people living with sight loss. This will provide direct local one-to-one access to our services by breaking down barriers of transport affordability and rural and social isolation. Our dedicated community team will support and be the vital link to vulnerable residents in their own homes and at locally based pop-up days. We will also be able to continue to fund transport to the Blind and Partially Sighted Saltash club.
Where will the project/activity take place?	<ul> <li>At homes across Saltash.</li> <li>Drop-in events held annually at Saltash Library (4 February 2020 and another in December 2020 or February 2021).</li> <li>Fortnightly club meetings at Ashtorre Rock.</li> <li>Appointments at Saltash opticians as required.</li> </ul>

Who will benefit from the project? (What groups will benefit and approximately how many people will benefit in total)	Currently, we have 47 clients in Saltash that will benefit. Importantly, we know of a further 18 people that would benefit.
What evidence do you have that this project is required? (This might be survey work or statistical evidence)	<ol> <li>iSightCornwall's annual survey 2019 found that 35% of visually impaired people surveyed identified 'Access to Services' and 'Truro being too far away' as a significant barrier to maintaining or improving their level of well-being and independence.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>We know from our own database that we are only engaging with around 65% of visually impaired residents of Saltash.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Around 3,000 people in Cornwall* are diagnosed with severe and partial sight loss each year. Only 11% choose to register and therefore automatically referred to social care services. (*NHS 2015). This means that 89% do not receive a pathway to further help and emotional support.</li> </ol>

The team is qualified in Low Vision eye conditions.  The team records the number of referrals; the number of home visits, each individual is assessed using our Conversation Framework to develop an individual action plan.  Each client receives regular updates on iSightCornwall actions and a follow up call to assess satisfaction. Satisfaction levels are regularly recorded higher than 90%.
