	 CT outlined a potential digital inclusion project (attached) for the PL12 area which aimed to help people access and benefit from using the internet. Subject to a successful funding bid, it was agreed to invite Community Enterprises PL12 to a future CNP to further discuss and promote the project. St John expressed an interest but falls outside of the PL12 area. CT to explore possibility of a separate roll out project or other potential funding sources e.g. crowdfunder. 	
-	 date from Towns and Parishes following points were noted; Thanks conveyed to all the volunteer groups for their sterling efforts and continued invaluable help throughout the pandemic. Saltash and Torpoint have submitted bids to the 'Re- opening High Streets Safely' Fund. Botus Fleming Parish Council has applied to the Public Works Loan Board for a loan to purchase the recreation field. A survey of the community showed 93.4% were in favour of the Parish Council buying the land. Landrake with St Erney has seen an increase in dog fouling offences and the parish is looking to get more bins and enforcement. CT to give contact details to Cllr Francis. 	СТ

	•	St Germans has been running a successful free community larder at the Church lych gate.	
	•	Tideford is awaiting air quality monitoring data for the lockdown period.	
	•	Landulph – Emergency plan produced for potential impact of the Covid crisis and medical support team established. The parish also successful managed 'Operation Move' which saw the main street cleared of all vehicles in less than 24 hrs to enable resurfacing works to be undertaken (slides attached).	
	•	St John has worked to ensure footpaths are opened in the parish to improve access to the countryside. The local pub has opened a village shop during the lockdown period which has worked well. Parish Council has supported the volunteer group with a grant.	
	•	Antony – Volunteers have provided support for the community by helping with shopping, farm boxes have been delivered and the village hall has secured a covid19 grant. However there are now concerns about a planning application to convert the Carew Arms pub into holiday lets and the Parish Council is keen to pursue the potential to have it listed as an Asset of Community Value. CT to provide Cllr Peter Bulmer with further information on this.
