Albert Road and Silver Street, Saltash: Notification of Railway Survey Works and Road Closures – January 2026

We wanted to let you know that we'll soon be working in the Saltash area to complete preliminary survey works on the Royal Albert railway bridge. This essential work will help to keep the railway running safely and reliably.

We'll be in the area between **Thursday 8 January 2026 to Monday 2 February 2026**.

Please be advised that there will be two separate periods of full 24/7 road closure to allow these works to be completed safely:

- **Albert Road** from **Tuesday 13 January 2026 at 7am to Monday 19 January 2026 at 8am**. The road will be closed throughout this period.
- **Silver Street** from **Monday 19 January 2026 at 7am to Thursday 22 January 2026 at 8am**. The road will be closed throughout this period.

Please see the diagram overleaf. Access will be maintained to properties during this period.

Following the road closures, please be advised of the following scheduled temporary traffic lights and lane closures will be in place during the periods listed below:

- **Normandy Hill** from **Monday, 26 January 2026 at 12.01am to Saturday, 31 January 2026 at 12.01am** Duration: **5 days**. Traffic lights with lane closures.
- **Wolseley Road** from **Monday, 26 January 2026 at 12.01am to Saturday, 31 January 2026 at 12.01am** Duration: **5 days**. Traffic lights with lane closures.
- **Old Ferry Road** from **Tuesday, 20 January 2026 at 12.01am to Saturday, 24 January 2026 at 12.01am** Duration: **4 days**. Traffic lights with lane closures.

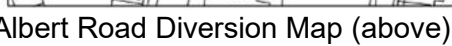
All of our staff will be clearly identifiable as all will be wearing bright orange personal protective clothing.

We work 24/7 to keep the railway running for passengers and freight, when the timetable is the quietest. Our work is often noisy, late at night and at weekends. We do our best to keep noise and disruption to a minimum and we try to be considerate by giving you as much notice as possible.

The nature of the tasks means we can't prevent all noise, but our teams will try to minimise this as much as possible. We're sorry if we disturb you.
